ERICA database

The ERICA database is based on a reduced format which contains around 280 items. Concerning year 2016 data, around 160 items have been collected per group on average.


For example, we have used:

- 20 items for financial structure
- 8 items for profitability analysis

The sample is mainly representative for listed non-financial European groups. The number of groups by country depends on the way used to obtain the data (in blue, extraction from national databases; in green, manual filling).

However, it is useful to note that IFRS are not always implemented in the same way and that groups do not communicate on the same level of detail.


Number of groups collected in ERICA (On average 160 items collected by group for year 2016)



COVERAGE OF ERICA DATABASE IN EACH COUNTRY




Main results obtained from ERICA Databases


 EBIT margin (EBIT / Revenue): Important increase for the total sample due to an increase in the energy sector




Return on Equity - Profit before tax/Equity: To increase except in the small groups



Financial debt / Total assets: Moderate increase in financial debt




 EBITDA / asset: The EBITDA to asset ratio remained stable between 2015 and 2016



· Financial debt structure by country and by sector

Financial markets appear to be predominant in debt financing of European listed groups. That is the case for all countries except Austria. The importance of financial markets ranged from 83% in Belgium to 39% in Austria, where bank lending was the major source of debt funding (53%). By sector and size, the majority of debt funding in energy, industry and for large groups came from financial markets (above 60%).
